WEDDING POSTPONED?

As I write this Covid restrictions are being increased. Weddings are reduced from 30 people to 15.

Pubs and restaurants must close from 10pm. Greetings cards announce that the sender is 'thinking of you' on what 'would have been your wedding day.'

Our lives have been turned upside down. Terrifyingly there is no sign of life turning right-ways-up any time soon.

The psalms are great – they contain every emotion. Anger, fear, pain, grief, frustration, trust, hope, joy. Sometimes all in a few lines. Nothing is off limits. Nothing is beyond God's care. Nothing is unacceptable to say to God. There's nothing he won't listen to. Nothing that he is not prepared to hear. We do not have to pretend in front of him.

God already knows how we feel and he loves us completely.

I'm always struck by the image of Jesus praying in the garden of Gethsemane. He knows what is



coming. His dozy disciples are less use than a chocolate teapot.

Judas, one of his inner circle, is about to betray him and hand him over to the Roman authorities.

And Jesus knows its going to hurt.

Over and over Jesus prays. Alone in the darkness. He begs his dad to find another way.

The future looks bleak. But Jesus does not give up. He doen't run away. He doesn't reject God. He keeps praying until he finds the strength to carry on (Luke 22:43).

And this is where we find ourselves. The world is uncertain and frightening. The virus is not under control. The economy is failing. We have the same choice. Will we take our fears and our anxieties, our hurt and our anger to God in prayer? Or will pile them into a wall of hate or hurt that separates us from his love?

Because God already knows.

He knows something that we may think in our minds but which is very difficult to feel in our hearts. He knows how the story ends. With a glorious wedding feast. An endless celebration of love. When God returns live with his bride, the church, for all eternity (Rev 22). We may not have a date, but we know that day is coming.


BLACON ACTION TEAM – A STORY OF COLLABORATION

. Blacon Action Team did not exist before March 2020. Then, when lockdown happened, from the third week of March, a collaborative effort started between Holy Trinity Church, The Community Store on Western Avenue, and Blacon Beacon (a new charity, more of which is on pages ... of this Parish News), to provide emergency food for those in need in the community. Other organisations also became involved in the collaborative effort, including: the local schools, Cheshire West Communities Together, Avenue Services, CWAC, Here and Now, Welcome Network.

As many will know, the church hall became a major hub for the distribution of food to people in the community – there were two collection times from the hall and two from the Community Store, and also deliveries were made to those unable to get out and who had nobody to collect for them. This turned the hall into

something like a food warehouse for several weeks. Anyone coming to the hall now will see – a hall. The food is being stored in two rooms – the previous room that Blacon Beacon had built (which in former years had been the stage) and the new room at the side of the building (where the fover used to be). In the summer, BAT decided the level of work that was going into providing food for so many in the community was not sustainable long term, and the funding which had been generously provided especially by Westminster Foundation, would not last forever either. So, we made a decision that the food bag distribution would not be continued by BAT beyond September, and those activities were handed over to Blacon Beacon and the Community Store. Our hope is that BAT will nevertheless continue to provide various services within the community in the months and years going forward.

To mark the 'end' of the food distribution that BAT provided, we decided to have a look at the overall amount of work that the team had been able to do for the community across 24 weeks. Our thanks go to Rob Campbell and Georgia Gough who did some work on this for us. The total number of people (of any age) fed in those weeks (through food bags, not including the cooked meals) was 10,832.



These people came from altogether 3910 households. 52% of those were households including children or teenagers. 27% were adults living alone, and 13% were homes where only elderly people lived. Some households those received several times, so that represents altogether 453 different homes. Producing this amount of food (we estimate that 7820 bags were packed) took a great deal of people-power – about 26 volunteers gave us 1882 hours across the weeks.

An extraordinary effort – thank you so much to everybody who contributed in any way!

BLACON BEACON



Meet Kerry Cook the new manager for Blacon Beacon. She has a background working in the travel industry, and then when she found herself furloughed at the start of lockdown, she decided to use her spare time by volunteering. As a

Blacon resident, she was directly to Holy Trinity Church Hall, and the work of Blacon Action Team providing food parcels for those in need.

Within a few weeks, she found herself at the centre of the team, and enjoying being able to help the community. So, when it became clear her job for the travel agency was not going to be as it had been for the foreseeable future, it seemed the natural thing for her to apply for the post of Manager.

Blacon Beacon is a charity based at Holy Trinity Church hall, which provides weekly food bags for its members. Members need to be Blacon residents who have some need, and who commit to paying a weekly membership (£3 for single people; £5 for families) as part contribution toward the cost of the bag. The food bags include fresh fruit and veg as well as non-perishable packaged and tinned produce.

Holy Trinity PCC have decided that this year the harvest donations will be collected for Blacon Beacon. *If you want to make a donation of non-perishable foods, please bring it to the church in time for our Harvest Thanksgiving service on Sunday 11th October.*

Dealing with Loneliness and Isolation: FIVE TOP TIPS



1. Pray – light a candle, if safe, and pray for hope, faith and strength to keep loving and caring for each other during this time of struggle.



2. Talk about how you feel.

This may be difficult if you are self-isolating, but use the phone, internet and social media. If you need to contact a counsellor, this can be arranged by your GP, local agencies or privately. Samaritans are there 24 hours a day, every day, and it's free to call them on 116 123.



3. Focus on the things that you can change, not on the things you can't.



4. Look after yourself – physically, emotionally, spiritually. Plan things that you enjoy at regular intervals during the day – a TV programme, a phone call, a book, a favourite dish, a game.



Look after others - even if only in small ways, but do what you can: a smile, a kind word, writing a letter or an email.



Who Authorised The Bible, Anyway?

Question: If it was the Church that finally decided which books should be included in the Bible, then isn't the Church the top authority?

Answer: No; the Bible produced the Church, not the Church the Bible. This is the real issue: what caused a book to be accepted within the 'Canon' of Scripture? (Greek: kanon, 'standard' or 'rule').

As far as the Old Testament was concerned:

- 1. Books that were recognised by Jesus Christ as infallible 'Scripture' could not be broken (Matthew 5:18). In John 10:35 Jesus didn't have to explain what He meant by 'Scripture', though elsewhere He did refer to its different categories (law, prophets, psalms) as pointing to Himself (Luke 24:44; Matthew 24:37). All was to be believed and obeyed.
- 2. Books that were recognised by God's people because of their impact. God's people will always recognise His voice (John 10:27). Jesus clashed with the Pharisees for adding their traditions to the Scripture; yet all were agreed that the Old Testament Scriptures were God's word.
- 3. Books that were recognised by the New Testament. It is significant that the New Testament features hundreds of Old Testament allusions. Only two are from the body of books known as the Apocrypha (Jude 9, 14) seemingly in similar style to Paul's quotation from a Greek poet (Acts 17:28). The Apocryphal books were perceived to be on a lower level.

Next, what determined inclusion in the New Testament Canon?

1. Books that are Christ-centred in their emphasis. It was inconceivable to the early Church that the Gospels, for example,


which focused so much upon the life and death of Jesus, could have any lower place than that given to the Old Testament Scriptures.

- 2. Books that are apostolic in their teaching. It was to the apostles exclusively that Jesus promised guidance 'into all truth' through the Holy Spirit's inspiration (John 16:13). The result of this was the New Testament (1 Corinthians 2:12,13). Significantly, Peter brackets Paul's writings with what he calls 'the other scriptures' (2 Peter 3:15,16).
- 3. Books that are faith-building in their effect, and thus, to be read in the congregations (John 20:30,31; 1 Thessalonians 5:27; Colossians 4:16; 1 Peter 2:2; Revelation 1:3). When the Christian scriptures take hold of the thinking of masses of people, they have the effect of 'stabilising society, without sterilising it' (historian T. R. Glover).

The books of the Old Testament were becoming largely accepted by AD 70; those of the New Testament by the end of the second century. The drawing of a line around them discouraged forgers and religious peddlers.

So no one really 'put' the books into the Bible; they put themselves in, because of their innate quality. No council by itself could have conferred authority upon the books; this, they possessed already. It is an authority that is inherent, not imposed. If art lovers say of a Renoir painting, 'This is a genuine Renoir',





