REMEMBERING and REMEMBRANCE

Our memories are good at playing tricks on us. Why is it I only remember summer holidays as being sunny when I was a child? And how often has what I remember been shaped by what other people remind me of an incident?

This is the time of year for Remembrance. The time of year when traditionally we spend time particularly thinking of those who gave their lives for us in wars, and especially in the World Wars. Those are events I have no memory of, I was not even born then. But calling to mind those people who died, who gave their lives for freedom in our country, even if we do not ourselves personally know any of the fallen, is an important aspect of the Remembrance.

That is what we intentionally call to mind during the 2 minute silence. That is something which is so valued by our society, that a minute's silence has not infrequently become the way our nation marks, and remembers, tragedies or atrocities that occur.

As the Christian Church, we also have a regular time for remembering. Whenever we share Communion, we are remembering the death of One on our behalf. That one perfect sacrifice made once for all upon the cross, is brought to us every time we share the bread and the wine, as he commanded us to. That is made real in our presence, through sharing the elements of simple food and drink, and through the words, and the prayers of God's people gathered together.

This is also a time of year for Remembering our own loved ones who have recently died, and who have gone before us. It is a time when we spend a while remembering them, and focussing on the hole that is left. We might do that on many other days also, but All Souls-tide is the time of year to intentionally mark the loss. It is not as though we could ever forget them, but setting time aside to remember, to pray, to hear God's word bringing us comfort, can be so valuable.

It is important to look back and remember – not just out of a nostalgic reminiscence. It is important as it helps us understand our lives today, and how they came to be this way. It reminds us of what is important, and the mistakes of the past that must be avoided.

It is also important to give us a sense of perspective, so that we can see where we have been, and look forward to where we are going. The Christian remembering of Christ's death on the cross reminds us of the fallen state of humankind, but also points us to the future hope of eternal life in God's Kingdom to come, a time when there will be no more wars or fighting, no more death or dying, no more injustice or grieving or pain or tears.

So, in this season, and in the midst of the on-going pandemic, let us certainly look back and remember, let us spend time

together in silence and in grief, but let us also remember that God is doing a new thing, let us look up and see the hope of glory which lies ahead for us.


Dealing with Loneliness and Isolation: FIVE TOP TIPS



1. Pray – light a candle, if safe, and pray for hope, faith and strength to keep loving and caring for each other during this time of struggle.

2. Talk about how you feel.

This may be difficult if you are self-isolating, but use the phone, internet and social media. If you need to contact a counsellor, this can be arranged by your GP, local agencies or privately. Samaritans are there 24 hours a day, every day, and it's free to call them on 116 123.





4. Look after yourself – physically, emotionally, spiritually. Plan things that you enjoy at regular intervals during the day – a TV programme, a phone call, a book, a favourite dish, a game.



5. Look after others - even if only in small ways, but do what you can: a smile, a kind word, writing a letter or an email.


PRAYERS FOR USE AT THIS TIME

A BETRAYAL OF TRUST

A BETRAYAL OF TRUST, the independent report into the Church's handling of the allegations concerning the late Hubert Victor Whitsey, former Bishop of Chester, was published on 22nd October 2020. This learning lessons review was carried out by His Hon David Pearl and independent safeguarding consultant Kate Wood.

The Church supported the police in an investigation into allegations of sexual offences against children and adults by Whitsey dating from 1974 onwards when he was Bishop of Chester and from 1981 while he was retired and living in Blackburn. The church commissioned this review in 2017. The report concludes that he abused at least 18 children and young people, perhaps more.

The report's authors said 'The findings of our review will make deeply uncomfortable reading for the Church and we know will be very difficult for victims as they are reminded of their appalling abuse by a senior Church figure in a position of trust. Their suffering was clearly made worse by the poor response of Church officers at different times when they had the courage to come forward.'

The Bishop of Chester, Mark Tanner said:

"There are no words to express my horror and shame as I read this report; and even if there were, words alone are not enough. Our apologies, which are freely and sincerely given must be backed up by action. I am grateful to all those who have already helped us start to change, to Judge Pearl for this report, and most of all to the incredibly brave survivors who have spoken up and made us listen. It is with them and all victims of abuse that my thoughts and prayers rest today as I commit myself and the Diocese of Chester to respond in word and action to this report."
